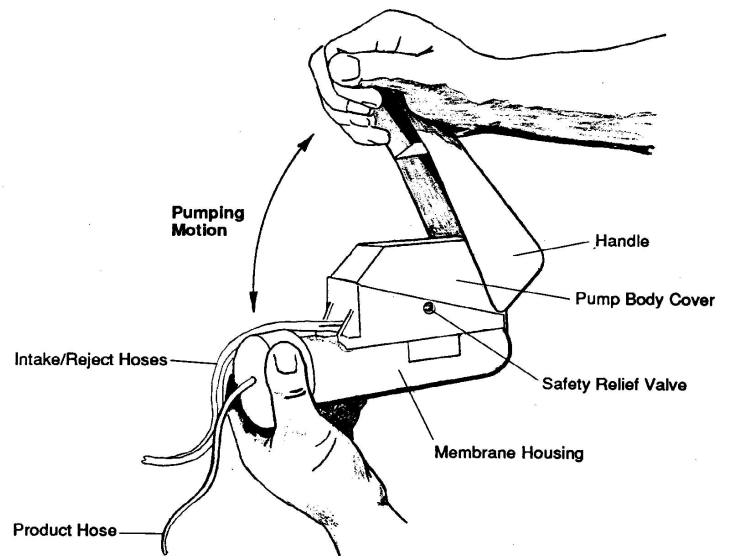


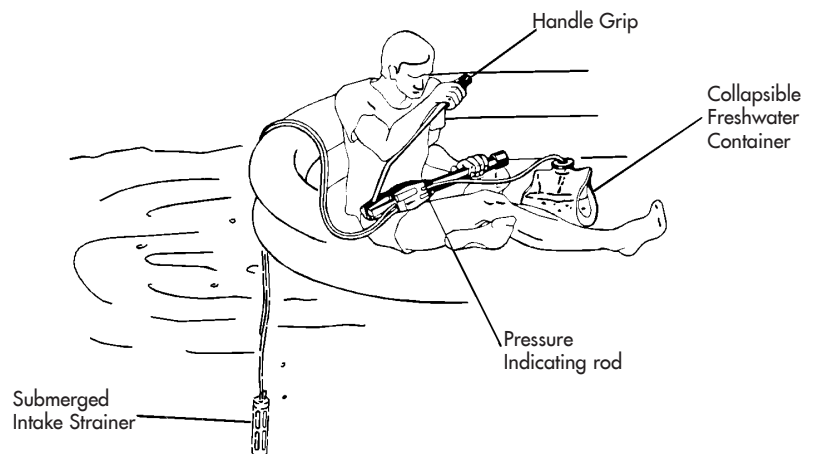
Katadyn Survivor 06
